



### **Context**


- Case Yellow was successful

  - Enables U.S. to send arms





Directive No.16 that initiated preparation for Operation Sea Lion targeting the RAF












Bombing of Berlin by command of Churchill in retaliation to bomb detonating in London








### Military Shortcomings

- Germany needed air and naval superiority
  - · Kriegsmarine was poorly equipped
- Luftwaffe Hermann Goerring
  - Aircraft is compartively slow
- Britain's strategic framework for the Battle was different for Germany's



  - communication tactic for success








